Nebraska Transit Trends

2016 TRANSIT MIDWEST CONFERENCE

The 2016 Transit Midwest Conference was another great success for the NATP. This is the second time Nebraska has joined forces with the transit associations of Kansas, Missouri and Iowa to provide a three-day event. The four states first joined together in 2013 for the inaugural event.

This year's event was held August 14-16 at the Westin at Crown Center in Kansas City, Missouri. The planning committee spent many hours coordinating this event. Nebraska was in charge of the exhibitors and sponsors. We actually had to turn down some exhibitors because we ran out of space! Thank you to the exhibitors and sponsors for their support and helping make the conference happen.





There were over 400 attendees and 66 exhibitors that filled the exhibit hall and overflowed into the foyer. A Bus Expo that featured 13 vehicles was offered just outside of the property on Grand Boulevard. Participants could visit the indoor and outdoor vendors throughout the day.

Twenty NATP managers attended the event. Some attendees utilized the transportation provided that started in Ogallala and made stops in North Platte, Grand Island and York.



The event kicked off Sunday evening with a welcome reception in the exhibit hall. Most exhibitors were set up and ready to visit with attendees. Attendees then had the evening to explore Kansas City on their own. Many Nebraska attendees were able to enjoy some authentic KC Barbeque at Gates Bar-B-Q.

The NATP Board met Monday morning for a quarterly meeting. All attendees then gathered

for an opening session with a welcome from Region 7 FTA Administrator Mokhtee Ahmad. Matt Welbes, Executive Director for FTA, provided a keynote address. The first general session included panelists Richard White (American Public Transportation Association), Bud Wright (American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials), and Scott Bogren (Community Transportation Association of America). The second general session was provided by Congressman Emmanuel Cleaver. The last general session included information and updates from Homeland Security.

Following the morning session, attendees then had time to visit with exhibitors. Lunch followed with a welcome from

NDOR included an outline of their goal to define regional transportation and planning boundaries,

establish permanent statewide and regional committees with rotating members, and place mobility managers in each region. Compliance site visits, vehicle and liftmaintenance and vehicle disposition procedures were also discussed. And, of course, there was the announcement that the 2017 RTAP Conference will be held in Omaha, Nebraska!

Another great opportunity to learn and network is just around the corner! The NATP Driver's Training and Roadeo provides your drivers with classroom learning and hands-on skills training that will increase their level of knowledge and ability to handle the many challenges they face each day on the job. Also, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in each division win cash prizes, while 1st place winners and their managers earn a scholarship to the National CTAA Roadeo and EXPO in Detroit, Michigan next June!

One more very important event to emphasize is the NATP membership meeting to be held at 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, September 20 at the Holiday Inn and Convention Center in Kearney.

Because too few members were able to attend the annual meeting held in Kansas City during the Transit Midwest Conference, there was not a guorum to conduct a business meeting. As a result, we will hold elections for the NATP Board of Directors at the September meeting, provided that we have a majority of the membership present. This requires an effort on the part of each member to schedule appropriately so that you may attend the meeting and have your voice be heard. While the Board of Directors is a dedicated group, they still

sessions were offered throughout the day including the Nebraska Rural Network Session. Kari Ruse provided the members an update on transportation statistics in Nebraska. In the last fiscal year: 2,854,291 vehicle miles traveled 676,308 passenger boardings 458 vehicles (273 public, 185 private). Kari also discussed the Mobility Management Project.



The Statewide Coordinating Committee has met several times over the past year and regional committees are starting to form as well. There are six "pilot projects" taking places across the state. They are working on a proposal to introduce to the legislature to establish regional coordinators. This would give NDOR the authority to create regional boundaries, establish a committee, hire mobility managers, etc. Kari also discussed the Statewide Vanpool Project which is eligible for federal subsidies.

Kari also discussed FTA programs including Transit Asset Management which is established to keep transit properties in a state of good repair, manages vehicles and facilities, and a state TAM plan that is in production (systems can adopt the state plan or develop their own). Safety Management workshops are planned for 2017 which will help systems develop safety plans.

Kari also announced that the 2017 National RTAP Technical Assistance Program will be held in Omaha. NDOR will be looking to NATP members to volunteer on a planning committee and during the event.

Kari also spoke during the State DOT Best Practices Summit where she provided information on the new dashboard system that was developed in Nebraska.

NATP held an association meeting on Tuesday afternoon. Since there was not a quorum, no business could be held and elections were not conducted. President Scott Bartels provided a recap of NATP activities from the past fiscal year. Treasurer continued on page 5

The NATP 24th Annual Statewide Roadeo will be held on Wednesday, September 21. This year we are having a 70's theme. Prizes will be given for the best dressed! Drivers can attend the Roadeo & BBQ event without competing in the Roadeo. There are four components of competition at the Roadeo.

Individuals may not receive scholarships for more than two consecutive years. The fee to compete is \$50. The Roadeo is an outside event - snacks will be provided. Please bring a lawn chair. An appreciation BBQ will be held at 3:00 p.m. following the Roadeo. There is no cost for the BBQ and everyone is invited to attend, even if you don't compete in the Roadeo.
