NEBRASKA PUBLIC TRANSIT MAINTENANCE & STORAGE FACILITIES

During the recent NATP Managers Conference in Kearney, there was a short presentation on transit bus maintenance/storage facilities. I would like to update everyone on the progress of several facilities either in the planning stage or being constructed.

Recently, representatives from the FTA regional office in Kansas City, MO and the NDOR participated in a ground breaking ceremony at North Platte and a ribbon cutting in Sidney. The Sidney facility was a rehab of an existing building and was completed in April. The North

Platte facility is new construction and is expected to be completed in October 2012.

In addition to these two facilities, a ribbon cutting ceremony for the Phelps County transit facility in Holdrege is being planned for July 2012 as is a ground breaking ceremony for the RYDE Transit facility in Kearney. The Kearney facility is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2013.

Facilities in Saline County, Webster County, Scotts Bluff County, and Tri Valley Health System in Cambridge are all in the planning or pre-design stage at this time. Saline County is in the process of negotiating with an Architectural and Engineering firm for design of their facility. Webster County has an Architectural and Engineering firm on board and is in the process of designing their facility. Scotts Bluff County and Tri Valley Health System in Cambridge both have received environmental clearance and are in the planning stage of their projects.
